To participate at the Games playoffs, which will be held in the fall (Sept.-Dec.), athletes must be a resident of Zone 1. If a team has members from two or more Saskatchewan Games zones and is registered in a recognized league, it shall compete in the zone where the majority of their players reside. Athletes residing at an address outside of Saskatchewan are eligible to compete at the Games if they meet several conditions. Please contact the Zone 1 Sports Council Office (429-2205) if you fit into this category or have questions about your eligibility.

A full contingent of Zone 1 athletes total 221. Therefore, if all eight zones of Saskatchewan have full representation at the Saskatchewan Winter Games, 1,768 athletes will be participating in this event.

One more reminder to all coaches! To participate in the Saskatchewan Winter Games and the playoffs leading up to the Games, all coaches must be N.C.C.P. (National Coaching Certification Program) certified - at least Level I. This means each coach must have his/her Level I Technical & Practical in their specific Games sport, along with their Level I Theory. Our next Zone I Level I theory will be held in Moosomin, July 10 and July 17,
