## lown council briefs

Masons confirm The Northern Light Masonic Lodge confirmed its commitment to take title to the property which will house the new combined lodge and United Church building. The original request was for the land to be held jointly by the two parties but until the church has the necessary approval from Presbytery and national head office they will lease the land from the Masonic Lodge.

Closure approved Town council approved the closure of centre street in front of the IGA on May 30 and 31 due to a double booking of the arena. The 4-H Show and Sale and the annual inspection of the Air Cadets are in date conflict this year. The cadets will hold their inspection on the street rather than in the arena. Both evenings are required because they must have a practice before the official inspection. The council questioned how the double booking had taken place and asked administration to look into the problem.

Request tabled Council tabled a request from Meadow Lake Auto Wrecking to lease two acres behind their land. The land in question belongs to the town and before approval will be considered the council asked for

more information.

Subdivision approved The town council has expressed no objection to a subdivision proposal by the Meadow Lake Credit Union to turn a building site into a warehouse area. Several councillors expressed approval for the change of use this would make to the land in question.

Week declared Meadow Lake town council has declared June 13-17 as Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics Week. The local detachment has requested permission to hold a fit-walk on June 13 at 12 noon up

Centre Street. Council approved the walk.

Application to be made The town will be applying for funding under the Tree Plan Canada program. The program asks for a plan to be put in place for planting trees and beautification. Since the plan exists the council saw benefit to making the application for additional funding. This is a federal program and will apply to next year.

Motion passed The town passed a motion which will allow the Northlands Pioneer Lodge to amalgamate with the North West Health District on June 1 if all the paperwork in Regina can be completed on time. A meeting was to be held on Thursday to have the order signed by the minister in time for the transfer to occur on that date.
