Cross-country skiers lead Zone 2 medallists

Maryann Yachyshyn and Paul Lundlie, both from Zone 2 (Regina), came back with three gold medals and big smiles from the 1993 Saskatchewan Special Olympics Winter Games held Saturday in Melfort.

Yachyshyn and Lundlie won their gold medals in cross-country skiing.

Yachyshyn was first in the women's 100-metre final, the 400m and the 800m.

Lundlie placed first in the men's 100m, the 400m and the 800m.

Other double-gold medallists from Zone 2 in cross-country skiing were Donald Kernahan (100m and 400m) and Carolyn Boulding (100m and 400m). Lyle Holowka of Regina won two gold and one silver medal in snow-shoeing. He was first in the men's 100m and the 400m. He placed second in the 200m.

In speed skating, Robbie Bomboir and Robert Pisula, both from Regina, each earned a gold and silver medal. Bomboir was first in the men's 500m and second in the 300m. Pisula, competing in another section, won a gold medal in the 300m and earned a silver medal in the 500m.

Betty Zboril of Regina placed first in the women's level I figure skating event.

Approximately 100 athletes and 45 coaches from the province's eight sporting zones attended the Games.
