The Queen's Baton, which is the Commonwealth Game's equivalent to the Olympic

Torch, will be in Saskatoon today.

The Baton relay started March 14 at Buckingham Palace in London and carries a message from Queen Elizabeth II to the Games, which will be held in Victoria Aug. 18-28. The baton arrived in Canada on April 11 and has been on a

cross-country tour since.

The Saskatoon leg of the baton relay starts at 11:30 a.m. at the boat launch in Victoria Park. The route goes from the boat launch across the Victoria Bridge, across Cosmopolitan Park, across the University Bridge and through Kiwanis park to the bandshell for the official ceremony at noon. There, it will be presented to

Lt. Gov. Sylvia Fedoruk.
