#### Reaction here neutral

The two major items that affect the business community are the increase in sales tax from five to seven per cent and the fuel tax of seven cents a litre, says the president of the Swift Current Chamber of Commerce.

Garth Knakoske said he canvassed about half a dozen members and said reaction from businesses was pretty

neutral but said the service stations he called were not sure how things would

work.

In Finance Minister Gary Lane's budget Wednesday, it said that there would be a fuel tax of seven cents a litre imposed on gasoline, diesel fuel and motor fuel with full rebates to Saskatchewan residents in 1988.

Garth Whyte of the Canadian Federation of Independent Business applauded Lane's assault on the deficit, but Al Johnston of the Saskatchewan Chamber of Commerce complained it wasn't enough

"There wasn't a lot of concrete plans in there," he said. "We still have a huge deficit carried over from previous years."

#### More staff?

Service stations may have to add staff to accommodate the new gas rebate brought down in Wednesday's

budget.
The provincial budget announced a seven cent per litre fuel tax on gasoline, diesel fuel and other motor fuels but also offered a full rebate to Saskatchewan residents in 1968.
"It could mean additional time and paper work to us," said Joe MacIssac, service station superintendent for the Pioneer Co-op Friday.
He said it will possibly mean an additional staff person at their Wheatland Mall location because it is a high volume outlet.

"They may have to put on another till or another person. We will have to play it by ear," he said.

He said prior to the new rebate they only made out invoices for cash purchases at the customers request and said now people will demand invoices for every purchase.

#### On diesel fuel

A tax on locomotive diesel fuel will increase to 15 cents a litre from 13.6 cents and the tax on aviation fuel will more than double to seven cents a litre

The fuel-tax increases are expected to bring in \$110.4 million.

to bring in \$110.4 million.

Also retroactive to Jan. 1, the corporate capital tax is extended to include trust and loan companies, a change which will raise \$2.2 million.

Lane dissolved the province's farm purchase program, set up in 1983 when interest rates were high and land prices averaged \$400 an acre to help young farmers start out. About 6,000 people took advantage of the program, which reduced interest rates on farm mortgages to wight per cent, to get into the farming business. Land prices and interest rates have since drooped.

"For years to come, June 17, 1987, will be remembered by the people of Saskatchewan as ... the day that our great province was thrown in a tail-spin by one of the most senseless and destructive budgets in our history," said NDP finance critic Ed Tchor-

zewski.
Liberal leader Ralph Goodale said
Lane's 23-page speech had no vision for the future.
