Torch run Toovey's last official act

Leading off the southeastern contingent in the Law Enforcement Torch Run for the Special Olympics will be Clayton Toovey's last official act as Canada's oldest serving police officer.

Although the 72-year-old Chief Toovey retired yesterday after 27 years with the Yellow Grass Municipal Police Force, he will be on hand June 11 in Yellow Grass to kick off the southeast leg of the torch run.

Chief Toovey will lead 13 members of area law enforcement agencies in the run to Regina to open the 1993 Saskatchewan Special Olympics. Represented in this year's run will be the Weyburn city police, RCMP detachments in Weyburn, Montmartre, Radville and Fillmore as well as high-

way traffic and conservation officers.

Organizer Sgt. Mike Rogal of the Weyburn Police Service added Estevan law enforcement officials have added to the run, and the torch will start there June 9. Weyburn police will join the run in Halbrite, taking the torch from there to Yellow Grass on June 10.

Fundraising efforts for the Special Olympics will begin with a hot dog and coke sale tomorrow in the parking lot of the Co-op food store from 4 to 8:30 p.m. There will also be a display set up at Weyburn Square.
